Adjacent to the Winterschool course 2018 "Population ecology and population cycles", Dr. Janne Sundell as main organizer of the course, we aim to organize a workshop on "Population cycles and outbreaks". Analytical tools and modelling have greatly improved during last decades when studying long-term data sets. As well more short-term experimental studies on mechanisms and processes of population change during different population phases have been carried out. However, it is hard to find anymore fierce itellectual debates in meetings and congresses, or even publications on causes of different types of population fluctuations in vertebrates, especially mammals. We, graduate students from 1980's and early 1990's could enjoy these events later named "vole wars", with excellent discussions and arguing.
